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Minutes of IQAC Meeting held on 22 October 2021 at Board Room

Dr. K Nirmala, Chairman of IQAC, welcomed all members. After going through the minutes of the previous meeting, the agenda for the current meeting was agreed upon by all the members.

Following issues were addressed during the meeting.

1. Commencement of Blended Learning

As the severity of Covid pandemic showed a downward trend, the possibility of going ahead with offline teaching and learning seemed quite likely. However, with more variants of Coronavirus becoming dominant at different times, it was suggested that blended learning would be a more preferred mode of education for both students and faculty members. Guidelines regarding the conduction of partial online and offline classes were discussed in the meeting.

2. Written Examination Assignments

It was observed that due to online teaching and learning, it was not possible for the institute to conduct written examinations for students. Hence Dr. Shalaka Parker, Dean MBA suggested that written assignments should be given to students based on each topic which could be used for student assessment instead of regular written exams. This would also give the much needed writing practice to students.

3. Online Cultural Activities

Cultural activities have a way to touch souls, move hearts, inspire creativity, bring out joy and contentment. Students cherish these memories throughout their lives. Instead of depriving students of such invaluable experiences, Dr. Kavita Suryawanshi, HOD, MCA, came up with the suggestion that online cultural activities should be planned and organized in which students could participate whole-heartedly without worrying about their safety.




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
